**Inside The Numbers**

Norman retained his WBO welterweight title for the second time with a KO-of-the-Year caliber hook to the jaw that left Sasaki flat on his back, prompting referee Gustavo Tomas to stop his count and wave the fight off at the 46-second mark of round five. Though responsive, Sasaki was still taken out of the ring on a stretcher. The final blow represented the third knockdown of the bout as Norman scored the first two in round one, then battered the brave but outgunned challenger with poise and patience until the end. Norman averaged 64.8 punches per round to Sasaki's 45.3 and ended the fight ahead 111-53 overall, 18-15 jabs, 93-38 power and 5-0 in the CompuBox round-by-round breakdown of total connects. Norman also feasted on Sasaki's porous defense as he landed 40% overall, 16% jabs and 58% power compared to Sasaki's 27%, 24% and 29% respectively. Sasaki's body attack was more successful (30-15 in total connects), but that was far negated by Norman's ability to land cleanly to the challenger's head.
